

# Clemson Library Is Assured Of \$30,000 Grant By Foundation

CLEMSON, Aug. 8.—Assurance of a \$30,000 grant to be paid to the Clemson college library over a three year period by the General Education Board of the Rockefeller Foundation was announced here today by Dr. Robert Franklin Poole, president of Clemson.

The General Education Board, of which Raymond B. Fosdick is president, specified that the funds are to be used for strengthening the library collections, particularly the reference books.

"The grant will enable us to purchase many much-needed books and periodicals for both student and faculty study and research," Miss Cornelia Graham, librarian, said this morning, "and will help us a great deal in our constant

campaign to build a library at Clemson college of which the entire state will be proud."

The Clemson library has recently added a reference librarian to its staff and plans to add an assistant in charge of government documents and an assistant in charge of circulation in the near future.

The new member of the staff is J. Mitchell Reames, a Furman university graduate who followed graduate study in library science at the University of North Carolina and has served in the Navy for the past four years.

During the 1946-47 college year Clemson college plans to add two more professionally trained librarians to the staff here and to provide additional equipment and im-

proved facilities.
