DEPOSITS IN CLEMSON COLLEGE CORNERSTONE

From the news account in the Charleston News and Courier of the laying of the cornerstone at Clemson College July 28, 1891. Datelined Fort Hill, July 28.

The deposits were made in the cornerstone by Deputy Grand Master H. Dixon Corbett as follows: Names of officers of the Grand Lodge and Pendleton Lodge; trustees of Clemson College; names of Free Masons at work at College; roll of Seneca City Lodge; roll of Barrett Lodge; specimens of Continental money, silver and gold coin; a history of Pendleton papers, 1812-1819-1822; photographs of six of the trustees of the College; chart of the Clemson family tree; sketch of life of John C. Calhoun; diploma of Thomas G. Clemson, from Paris College of Mining; Col. Simpson's Greenville; J. E. Wannamaker, St. Matthews; J. L. Orr, Greenville; J. E. Life of Clemson; proceedings in contested Clemson will case; The News and Courier, July 1 and 27; Charleston Sun, July 25; Charleston World, the State, the Greenville News, July 24 and 26; People's Advocate, July 27; World-Budget; specimens of Confederate money; a sketch of the College; copy of the Cotton Plant; copy of the Alliance Monitor containing a copy of the annual address of President Stokes, of the State Farmers' Alliance; miscellaneous collection of papers (so announced;) name of architect of the College; a choice collection of flowers from Miss Bessie Norris, and a pencil from Mr. D. K. Norris, Jr.
