Cadet Donations Swell British War Relief Fund

Contributions had swelled the British War Relief society fund to well over one hundred and fifty dollars by last Monday night, Major S. Maner Martin, president of the Clemson chapter said yesterday. Clemson students had donated about forty dollars to the fund which will be used to buy a rolling kitchen for the stricken areas of England.

Officials of the Clemson chapter, in commenting on the national orginization, quoted official figures last night which proved that to date the cost of collections for the society had amounted to only seven percent of the total contributions. The only expense, according to those figures, has come in the actual purchase and distribution of membership pins and cards.
