

JOHN C. CALHOUN'S DUTCH OVEN IS DISCOVERED



This old stone fireplace in one of the rooms of the Calhoun Mansion at Clemson now looks as it did in the day of the great Carolinian. Recently workmen found the Dutch oven, shown at right of fireplace. It had been plastered over by occupants of the house long after

Calhoun's time. Fire is placed in the small opening near the hearth, the smoke going into the main chimney. Bread and other food was cooked in the oven above. The Calhoun Mansion is being restored, thanks to interest by the United Daughters of the Confederacy and their
