MINUTES OF THE BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS COMMITTEE HELD MAY 14, 1946

The Buildings and Grounds Committee met at four o'clock on May 14 in the Filter Plant classroom, with the following members present: Holmes, Hunter, Lee, McGinty, Musser, Newman, and Watson.

This meeting was called to select a suitable location for two hundred more living units for veterans. After some discussion of the possibility of various sites, Mr. Lee moved that the area between the Field House and Seneca River, which is not immediately used by the Athletic and Animal Husbandry departments, be used for the location of these units. This motion was seconded by Mr. McGinty. In the discussion that followed, it was brought out that the Animal Husbandry Department expects to move its it was brought out that the Animal Husbandry Department expects to move its it was brought out that the present hog barn as a sheep barn. They also expect to retain some pasture land immediately around the sheep barn and the adjacent bottom-land pasture. The sloping hill toward Cemetery Hill will offer a location for a longer type of house, four to six apartments each. This site was unanimously selected by the committee.

Mr. A. G. Holmes reported for a sub-committee on names that might be used for the various buildings and streets. His report was accepted as information, and a copy was placed in each member's hands to make further study of this report. A meeting was called for Thursday, May 16, at twelve o'clock for further action on this report.

The committee adjourned.
