JULY 14, 15, & 16, 1908.

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of Clemson Agricultural College was held at the College July 14, 15, & 16, 1908. The meeting was called to order at 8:30 P. M., July 14, 1908, and the Secretary was instructed to call the roll. The following members were present:-

The minutes of the March meeting of the Board of Trustees were read, and, on motion, were ordered recorded as read.

RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

ON the 18th day of April, 1907, the angel of death entered the ranks of the Board of Trustees of Clemson Agricultural College and took away from the life membership our beloved friend and co-worker, JOHN E. BRADLEY. And in the providence and wisdom of Almighty God we have been called to mourn this irreparable loss. To this institution he was more than loyal, giving the best of his brain and heart to its up-building and its perpetuation; to the State of South Carolina he was a patriot, wise and true to all its intrerests; as a Confederate soldier, he was a rare spirit in the ranks of a rare body of patriots; to each and every member of this Board of Trustees he was a friend of true and tried devotion, and our language feebly expresses our deep and sincere regret at his death. "We shall look and long many days before we shall see his like again."

"He will not pass this way again,
But far beyond earth's Where and When
May he look back along the road
Where on both sides good seed he sowed.

"He will not pass this way again,
But wisdom guided his tongue and pen,
And love was his that so he did
Plant roses all along the way.

"He will not pass this way again,
But always courteous to men,
Faithful to friends, and true to God,
A fragrance on the path he trod."

Therefore, Be it Resolved: First. That this institution by his death has lost his valuable services, which will always be cherished by those of us who knew those services best.

Second. That the State of South Carolina by his death has lost one of its best and highest citizens.

Third. That the already thinning ranks of Veterans of the war between the States laid aside in his grave and last resting place one of its bravest and truest.

Fourth. That this Board of Trustees has lost a friend whose image will be carried in our hearts so long as our days on earth shall last.

Fifth. That a copy of these resolutions be inscribed upon a page in our minute book, and a copy be sent to the family of our deceased friend and co-worker.

- 4.- The name of the department and division to which the goods are to be charged.
- 5.- They will endorse thereon: "A specific appropriation was made for the articles herein under the head of appropriation for(Naming the specific appropriation)....and a requisition therefor was approved".

6.- They will approve same as correct, (their signature meaning that the quality, quantity, and price of the goods are correct). The bill will then be forwarded to the Director of the department for his approval.

President Johnstone stated that he would announce the members of this committee at the night session.

Mr. Sease, Chairman of the Farm committee, requested that an appropriation of \$165. be made for an Insilage cutter and a blower, also \$700. for a barn, to replace the one that was burned--\$25. of the \$700. to become available at once and the balance after January 1st.

On motion, the above appropriation was made as requested.

Mr. Sease, Chairman of the State Board of Entomology, reported that Mr. Chambliss had tendered his resignation to take effect Aug. 1st. and requested that it be accepted. Mr. Sease stated that Mr. Chambliss would make his report by the 1st. of August in the shape of a bulletin on the ^{work} that he had been doing. He also informed the Board that the property in the office in Columbia had been packed and locked up.
