RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

N the 18th day of April, 1907, the angel of death entered the ranks of the Board of Trustees of Clemson Agricultural College and took away from the life membership our beloved friend and co-worker, JOHN E. BRADLEY. And in the providence and wisdom of Almighty God we have been called to mourn this irreparable loss. To this institution he was more than loyal, giving the best of his brain and heart to its up-building and its perpetuation; to the State of South Carolina he was a patriot, wise and true to all its intrerests; as a Confederate soldier, he was a rare spirit in the ranks of a rare body of patriots; to each and every member of this Board of Trustees he was a friend of true and tried devotion, and our language feebly expresses our deep and sincere regret at his death. "We shall look and long many days before we shall see his like again."

"He will not pass this way again, But far beyond earth's Where and When May he look back along the road Where on both sides good seed he sowed.

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"He will not pass this way again, But wisdom guided his tongue and pen, And love was his that so he did Plant roses all along the way. 502

"He will not pass this way again, But always courteous to men, Faithful to friends, and true to God, A fragrance on the path he trod."

Simpson, Chairman of the Finance Committee, read a letter from the Treasurer of the College which showed the expenditures and receipts of the Cadet Fund for the past fiscal year and requesting an appropriation of \$10,466.25 to cover the indebtedness of the Cadet Fund, which deficit was caused by the increase in the cost of groceries, etc.

On Motion, The appropriation of \$10,466.25 was made. <u>Moved, by Col. Simpson</u>, That officers of the college receiving goods, or supervising labor, shall brief all bills pertainto their respective divisions, as follows:-

1.- The amount of the bill with cash discount, if any, deducted.

2.- The name and address of party or firm to whom bill is

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payable.

3.- The date of the bill.
4.- The name of the department and division to which the goods are to be charged.

5.- They will endorse thereon: "A specific appropriation was made for the articles herein under the head of appropriation for(Naming the specific appropriation)....and a requisition therefor was approved".

6.- They will approve same as correct, (their signature meaning that the quality, quantity, and price of the goods are correct). The bill will then be forwarded to the Director of the department for his approval.

Be It Further Resolved, That any employee of the college who fails to hand in a bill promptly after receipt of goods, thereby causing the college to lose the cash discount, if any, will be required to re-imburse the college from his or her own personal funds.
