Columbia, S. C., Feb. 3, 1892

Resolved: That, since, it is the opinion of the Board of Directors of the South Carolina Penitentiary, that the Legislature, in passing an act giving Clemson College 150 convicts, did not intend, besides shaming, clothing, & guarding said convicts, to compel the Penitentiary, in addition thereto, to board the guards; and, since there is such a constant drain upon this Institution from different sources, the running & incidental expenses thereof being so enormously heavy, thereby necessitating a constant & exceedingly great strain all the while; and, since the financial condition of the Institution, owing to short crops, is in such a depressed state, we very respectfully request that the Board of Trustees of Clemson College will be so considerate of our financial embarrassment, as to release us of the expense of boarding the guards at said College, & allow us instead, to put a man there to cook for them, they (the Clemson College Trustees) furnishing the provisions & that this change take effect the 1st of March, 1892.
